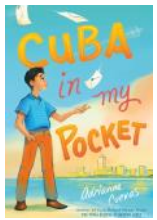
**T Angus - *Soldier Dog* by Sam Angus**

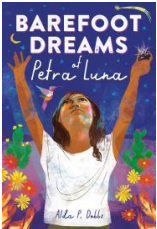
**T Boyne - *The Boy in the Striped Pajamas* by John Boyne**

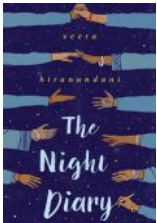
**T Cuevas - *Cuba in My Pocket* by Adrianna Cuevas**

**T Jackson - *Midnight Without a Moon* by Linda Williams Jackson**

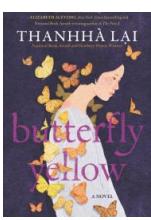

by Cynthia Kadohata

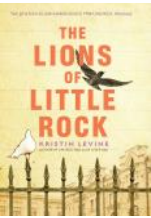

by Thanhha Lai

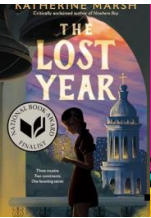

by Walter Dean Myers

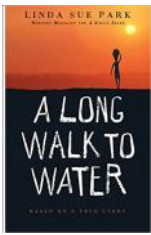

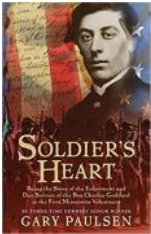

by Linda Sue Park

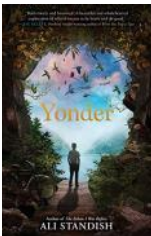

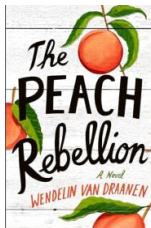
Eager to enlist, fifteen-year-old Charley has a change of heart after experiencing both the physical horrors and mental anguish of Civil War combat.

by Ali Standish

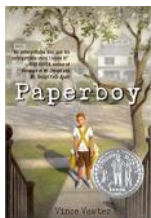
